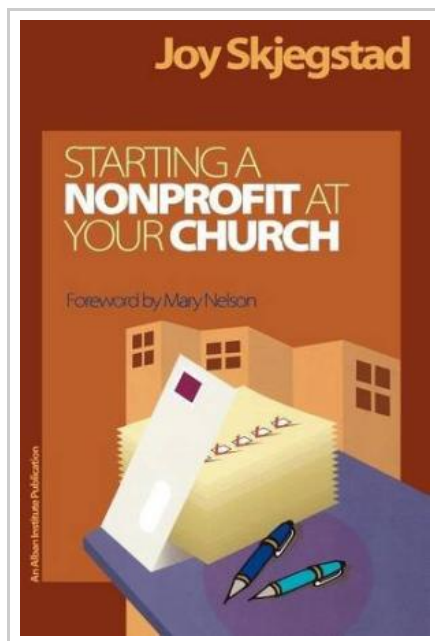




Starting a Nonprofit at Your Church (Alban Institute Publication)
