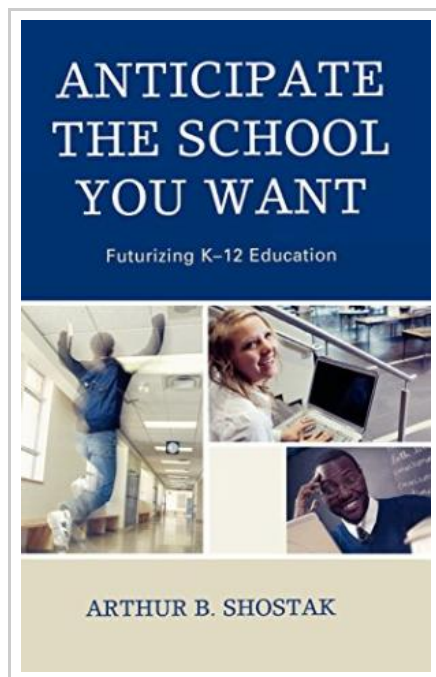




Anticipate the School You Want: Futurizing K-12 Education
