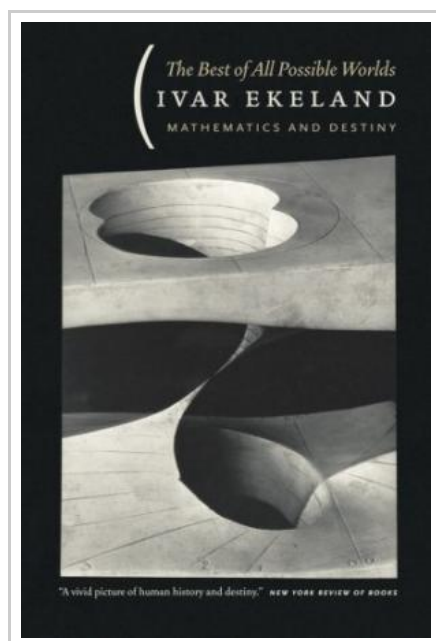




The Best of All Possible Worlds Mathematics and Destiny
